  - a. The district hired 3 new special education administrators
  - b. National teacher shortage. Working on retraining and recruiting strategies. Having a job fair and working with local colleges (Bridgewater).

- c. Allan Blume will be helping the special education staff with IEP writing strategies over the next year.
- d. Missed service tracking-(Literacy Working Group Recommendation) Formal system created by Brian Converse to keep track of data. No official number of missed services has been established as a definitive time to contact families, but communication is expected when multiple services have been missed

- g. Hired a district wide school psychologist to help with evaluations
- h. Writing program- (Literacy Working Group Recommendation) Wonders K-6 has tier 1 and tier 2 resources for writing instruction- training is active. Mass General WELL Collaborative to supplement the prescribed writing instruction of Wonders. Training continues (4-5 last year, 6,7,8 this school year) All special education staff have been trained in Framing Your Thoughts
- i. Fountas and Pinnell curriculum has been retired.
- j. The district is looking at High School services and schedules.
